As I write this, we have enjoyed a true spring day, where the sun shone and the temperature rose and it felt that our long winter is coming to an end. The clocks are just about to change to summer time. As someone who has worked in the outdoors for most of my working life, that sense of the coming of spring, the expectations centered on that change in the seasons, is something that I love. That sense of expectancy is echoed in the season of Lent.
